Misconstrue-(v.) to mistake the meaning of.

Misappropriate-(v.) to take dishonestly for ones own use.

Eli Millstone misappropriated funds from the Real Fresh Dairy and was caught.

Misdemeanor-(n.) in law, an offense less serious than a felony.

Littering is a misdemeanor, but it can still earn you community service.

Equidistant-(adj.) equal in distance

Points on a circle are equidistant from its center

unsaturated-(adj.) of or indicating a chemical compound in which two or more of the carbon atoms are joined by a double or triple bond and therefore can be combined with additional atoms. (2) capable of dissolving more of solute and unsaturated solution.

Subscript-(n.) a symbol (as a letter or number) below the text.

The two in the carbon-dioxide symbol (CO₂) is a subscript.
